- Partnership Roundtable: Develop a stable, national-level research-to-action partnership to advance a Black health agenda based on shared vision and shared priorities
- Dissemination of New Vision: Articulate and widely disseminate a new, positive vision of Black health and well-being and advocate (with data and stories) for multi-sectoral initiatives to overcome structural and institutional constraints

Roundtable Structure and Process

- Zoom semi-structured interview with the main liaison from each partner organization, including CBH; time would be 45 – 60 minutes; conducted by Shiriki or Melicia or both; audiotaped
- Topics to be covered
 - Your assessment of how well the project is meeting its original goals
 - Assessment of your personal role and the role of your organization in the Roundtable to date
 - Your assessment of how your organization is contributing to the Roundtable’s capacity to influence policy change
 - Aspects of the collaboration that have been challenging for you in representing your national organization on the Roundtable
 - Your experience with the MOU and subcontracting process
 - Your level of commitment (personally and your organization) to continue with the partnership in the future
 - Suggestions for improvements in organizational, programmatic, and funding model
 - Anticipated challenges, e.g., pending organizational leadership changes, etc.
 - Suggestions for the person(s) in your organization’s Atlanta chapter or affiliate that we should interview for the local review

Midcourse review

Atlanta Initiative

- Zoom semi-structured interview with person(s) suggested by the national liaison conducted by Sarita Davis - time would be 45 – 60 minutes, possibly with another CBH core team member listening in; audiotaped
- Topics to be covered
 - Descriptive information about your local chapter or affiliate, e.g., geographic coverage area; organizational model (e.g., non-profit; volunteers, paid staff, or both)
 - Prior engagement in advocacy in the Atlanta environment on behalf of your organization
 - Process from your perspective from beginning through end of first round, including interactions with your national office or Roundtable liaison
 - Your organization's interest in the issues we pursued re suspensions and expulsions
 - Assessment of effect of the COVID-19 constraints on the process
 - How your chapter is benefiting from this activity
 - Specific ways that you (or your chapter) have participated in this initiative so far, including internal or external communications
 - Your engagement with Rhonda Briggins
 - Your assessment of the initiative's effectiveness so far; suggestions for improvement
 - Identification of other stakeholders or organization to connect with at this point
